Doosan Forklift Part - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an international organization consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Equipment and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

Their United States affiliate, Doosan Infracore America Corporation, located in Suwanee, Georgia houses a 170,000 square foot production facility, home to a Compact Equipment and Construction division. Cleveland, San Antonio houses the Lift Truck division, and West Caldwell, New Jersey has a Machine Tool department. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client desires.

With a network consisting of over 90 independent sellers, the forklift group supplies quality materials handling equipment to the comprehensive North American market. Doosan Infracore America Lift Truck dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and sales locations throughout Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line impressively comprises of 63 different products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion forklifts. Capacities of these numerous vehicle designs vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All trucks are built in an ISO 9001 qualified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest growing forklift company in the North American market, due to their consistency in maintaining a high degree of client service quality and optimum product functioning to all Doosan Infracore Lift Truck users. The U.S. forklift division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Sales, Purchasing, Marketing, Logistical and Technical Support.

In the beginning the domestic lift truck marketplace in Korea was an open import enterprise. Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. began in 1960, to import fully assembled forklifts as part of a domestic equipment expansion venture. Product sales of these products were initially targeted to state-run corporations, large scale organizations, and the military. This eventually led to a unification with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division begun business operations throughout Korea to overhaul and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a forklift manufacturing plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical instruction grew to become the new focus for enhancing quality and product development.

Domestic forklift business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astounding 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's progressive technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of significant expansion of their lift truck business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative enterprise project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling industry. This plan drastically expanded Daewoo's forklift sales. Construction was finished in 1984 to facilitate a modern plant which helped set up the company for the fabrication of high added-value goods suitable for export. In 1993, the company had a international sales system and started exporting designs they had developed through in-house technology, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion possibilities into overseas markets.
